Come out to our 22lr Silhouette Shoot

Paper targets are fine for sighting in, but the real fun begins when you ring steel with a .22 LR. No recoil, minimal noise, and best of all affordable ammo and equipment. So come out on the first Saturday morning each month starting at 8:00 and join our Silhouette group. You will be shooting at swinging steel targets in the shapes of a chicken at 45 yards, a pig at 65 yards, a turkey at 85 yards and a ram at 103 yards (distances are approximate), so you get immediate feedback if you hit or not.

It is shot prone or from a bench on a rest or cross-sticks, 10 shots for score at each of the 4 distances. You will get to zero in with practice shots (sighters) at each distance before you shoot for score. We generally shoot with iron sights, but if you want to shoot with a scope that is fine, just come on out and enjoy some time on the range in an organized event. This is a great way to hone your shooting skills and is good training for younger shooters. Any .22 rifle will get you started. A partner with a spotting scope is typical, but we usually have volunteers willing to help out with sighting in and scoring. There is a \$10.00 entry fee, which goes back to the club with ribbons and bragging rights for the top score.

So come on out and bring your wife, husband, girlfriend, boyfriend and kids (under 17 shoot free). Hope to see you on the 100-meter range. Check the calendar on page 2

Ranges Closed/Open During Scheduled Shoots/Events

BLACK SWAMP - **Closes Cowboy Town, 300m & 500yd.** Open 50m, 100m & Trap

TRAP - **Closes Trap & 100m.** Open 50m, 500yd, 300m & Cowboy Town

MAD MINUTE - **Closes 50m, 100m & 500yd (the 100m & 500yd may be used with permission from the shoot director).** Open 300m, Cowboy Town & Trap

COWBOY/BLACKPOWDER/WILD BUNCH - **Closes Cowboy Town, 300m & 500yd (the 500yd may be used with permission from the shoot director).** Open 50m, 100m & Trap

22 SILHOUETTE - **Closes 100m & Trap.** Open 50m, 300m, 500yd & Cowboy Range

BENCHREST CHALLENGE - **Closes 300m, Cowboy Town & 500yd.** Open 50m, 100m & Trap

4H – **Closes Trap & 100m from 4pm and closes all other ranges from 6pm**

REVERE’S RIDERS – **Both days, closes 100m & Trap.** Open 50m, 300m & Cowboy Town; **Sun. 1pm-3pm closes 500yd & 300m.** Open 50m & Cowboy Range
